





## Is McCartney Dead !??

Is Paul McCartney of the famous and sometimes infamous, Beatles, really dead? ? There has been much speculation recently as to whether or not the "cutest of all the Beatles" is really dead or whether all of the rumors are merely a publicity

These so called rumors have been sweeping the campuses of the nation's colleges and high schools. A Beatle representative in London denies that any of the rumors are true and pro-claims that Paul is alive and well and is still playing his base

The University of Chicago has formed a group consisting of 30 people to analyze the clues from Beatle song lyrics and album covers that some say hold a hidden message that Paul, 27 by now, died years ago and has been replaced by a double.

The story has spread rapidly due to the fantasy that anyone who cracked the riddle got a ticket to Pepperland, and disappeared.

No one knows where the story started but it may have been started by the Beatles themselves. Of the many clues to the story there are several which really stand out, such as the Cover of the Beatles Sgt. Peppers Lonely Hearts Club album. The photograph shows the Beatstanding before a grave. There is a hand raised over Paul's head-a symbol which many people regard as an ancient sign of death. Directly above the hand there is a face which is thought to be that of Jesus Christ. other Beatles smile at the camera, Paul turns his back to it. The album's centerfold shows Paul wearing a black armband, a sign of mourning. He also is wearing a button with the letters "OPD" for "Officially Pronounced Dead".
